## Purpose of the PBO



To create a more level playing field for all parliamentarians



To ensure the accuracy of election commitment costings



To improve transparency, particularly around budget information and budget-related issues

## Purpose of the PBO



## Policy costings & budget analysis

Prepare high quality policy costings and budget analyses at the request of parliamentarians in a timely manner.

Develop and maintain our costing and projection models and databases.



#### **Self-initiated activity**

Publish research papers that promote a better public understanding of the budget and fiscal policy settings, with a particular focus on the sustainability of the budget over the medium term.




## **Election commitments report**

Prepare and publish a report analysing the budget impact of the election commitments of parliamentary parties after the next general election.




## Understand the Budget process

The **budget process** allocates public resources to the Government's policy priorities.

Parliament provides the authority

to spend money through the passage of the annual appropriation acts and other legislation



#### Our services

- You can request a costing from the PBO on a policy proposal. Requests will be confidential if made outside of the caretaker period.
- Costings and analysis services are designed to support you to participate in a more informed policy debate.
- We can't give you direct policy advice, but we can assist by discussing how different policy options could generate different impacts.



#### **Costing of policy proposals**

A costing is an assessment of the financial impact of a proposed policy change on the Commonwealth Government budget.



#### **Budget analysis**

A budget analysis assists in evaluating existing policies, or what affects a policy change would have on the budget or on different groups of people.

## Confidentiality

A request and the response will be kept confidential. We won't make public any information unless you release it or authorise us to publish it on our website.

This is different during a caretaker period before a general election when any costings requested during this period must be made public.

#### Build your own budget (BYOB)


An educational interactive tool to explore the impact of different economic assumptions and policy settings of your choice.

## The costing process

The PBO works closely with agencies and negotiates with requestors to seek to deliver a good outcome.

## Parliamentarian Request Feedback and clarification

Work with the PBO to specify information such as scope and start date

### Gather required information

**Information Request** 

PBO must use Government forecasts and fiscal estimates

#### **Undertake analysis**

Consult on sensitivities

Assumptions, methodology, data sources and caveats

#### Finalise the product

Confidential but may be published upon request

PBO do not provide policy advice

#### You must include...

#### Parliamentarian approval


- Request MUST be submitted by your parliamentarian
  - come from their @aph.gov.au email address
     OR
  - include a signed letter from them

#### **Completed template**

- Key information about who to contact
- Specifics about what to include in the costing analysis
