Agricultural and mining roads program								
Party:	The Coalition							
Summary of proposal:								
The proposal would provide \$600 million to upgrade agricultural and mining roads critical to getting product to domestic and export markets.								
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The program would be delivered over 4 years, would be non-ongoing and would start on 1 July 2025.

Costing overview

The proposal would be expected to decrease the fiscal and underlying cash balances by \$600 million over the 2025-26 Budget forward estimates period (see Table 1). This impact reflects an increase in administered expenses.

The proposal would not be expected to have an impact beyond the 2025-26 Budget forward estimates period, other than for public debt interest (PDI) costs. A breakdown of the financial implications over the period to 2035-36 is provided at Attachment A.

The Parliamentary Budget Office (PBO) has not made any assessment as to whether the specified funding would be sufficient to meet the objectives of the proposal.

Key assumptions & Methodology

Administered expenses were as specified in the proposal, distributed evenly over 4 years from the commencement date.

The costing assumes all allocated funds for each year would be fully spent, and departmental expenses would be managed within from within existing resourcing.

Financial implications were rounded consistent with the PBO's rounding rules.¹
