Summary of proposal: The proposal would reverse funding to Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts (DITRCA) for the Net Zero Unit and maritime strategic fleet.									
The proposal would start on 1 July 2025.									

Costing overview

The proposal would be expected to increase the fiscal and underlying cash balances by around \$8.3 million over the 2025-26 Budget forward estimates period (see Table 1). This impact reflects a decrease departmental expense.

The proposal would be expected to have an impact beyond the 2025-26 Budget forward estimates period. A breakdown of the financial implications (including separate public debt interest (PDI) tables) over the period to 2035-36 is provided at Attachment A.

Maritime strategic fleet expenses are commercially sensitive and values are denoted as not for publication (nfp) to not send pricing signals to the market. Values are not included in the totals.

Methodology and Key assumptions

The estimated savings are the reverse of the average staffing level of the Net Zero Unit in 2025-26 grown in line with Wage Cost Indices 3 (WCI 3). The staffing levels were provided by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts. The PBO has assumed that all the allocated funding would be available to be returned as a saving to the consolidated revenue fund.
